Reminder: Weekend Closure Starts Tonight on SB I-83 in the Harrisburg Region

I-83 south and ramp to I-283 south to be closed in Dauphin County

Harrisburg, PA – Motorists traveling in south central Pennsylvania are reminded southbound interstate 83, including the ramp to Interstate 283, will be closed tonight in the Harrisburg region due to scheduled road work. This work is expected to be performed tonight through Monday morning.

Southbound Interstate 83 and the ramp to Interstate 283 will be closed so a contractor can mill, pave and perform bridge repairs between Exit 47 (Route 322 East/Hershey/Eisenhower Blvd.).and Exit 45 (Paxton Street/Bass Pro Dr.).

Weather permitting, this work will begin at 8:00 PM tonight, Friday, August 11, and is expected to be completed by 6:00 AM Monday, August 14.

Detours will be in place for southbound I-83 and southbound I-283.

Motorists traveling south on I-83 should take Exit 47. Those continuing south on I-83 should bear right at the ramp to Paxton Street to access southbound I-83.

Those accessing southbound I-283 should proceed past the Paxton Street ramp on Eisenhower Boulevard, continue to the signalized intersection with Route 441, then turn left to access I-283.

Motorists can check conditions on major roadways by visiting www.511PA.com. 511PA, which is free and available 24 hours a day, provides traffic delay warnings, weather forecasts, traffic speed information and access to more than 1.000 traffic cameras.
