

MCM #4: Construction Site Stormwater Runoff Control

- **BMP:** Require E&S plans for any land disturbance greater than 1,000 sq. ft.
- **BMP:** Require the appropriate disposal of waste/debris/sediment on construction sites
- **BMP:** Develop an educational packet for permit applicants; including contractors, developers, and builders
- **BMP:** Develop a program to encourage compliance with Low Impact Development standards (LID)

BMP: Require E&S plans for any land disturbance greater than 1,000 sq. ft.

Measurable Goal: Dauphin County Conservation District (DCCD) and Londonderry Township already require all land developments of greater than 1,000 square feet to obtain an approved E&S plan from the DCCD. The Township will target this activity through educational materials and direct conversations with permit applicants.

BMP: Require the appropriate disposal of waste/debris/sediment on construction sites

Measurable Goal: All reported violations will be recorded on the MS4 Concern form which will prompt the Environment Department to either inspect an illicit discharge, construction violation, E&S, or some other MS4 related violation. Proper waste disposal will also be reviewed during the onsite construction inspection by the Township, Township Engineer, and/or the County Conservation District.

BMP: Develop an educational packet for permit applicants; including contractors, developers, and builders

Measurable Goal: The Township will also produce and make available, stormwater education materials for construction permit applicants such as, developers, construction managers, residents, and contractors. The goal is to reach every permit applicant that comes to the Township. Each person that walks away with a permit application should also receive educational material.

BMP: Develop a program to encourage compliance with Low Impact Development (LID) standards

Measurable Goal: During the second quarter of the current permit year, the Township will begin developing a Low Impact Development (LID) Program. The goal is to have the codes/zoning department distribute information on LID to permit applicants. The Township will also conduct an ordinance review to make LID mandatory.
