a. Approval of 2020 Vinewinder Race Course sponsored by the Vineyard at Hershey –
Requested approval of temporary road closures related to the 2020 Vinewinder Foot Race sponsored by the Vineyard at Hershey. Event is planned for Sunday May 17th, 2020 beginning at 1:00 p.m. The Fire Police will be involved with traffic control as in years past.

b. <u>Landowner Request for Rezoning</u> - Request from a landowner to re-zone a portion of their property.

Todd Smeigh of D.C. Gohn Associates and Trent DeArment owner of Homegrown Outdoor Finishes and Indian Rock Properties, located at 4189 East Harrisburg Pike made a brief rezoning request to the Board. The C-2 zoning map as presented doesn't line up with parcels and they filed a petition to make the zoning uniform throughout the property. Request is to remove the R-1 Residential and MH-Residential areas and those areas to be changed to C-2 Commercial to match the existing use.

Board requested the Planning Commission review their proposal at the next available Planning Commission meeting date before rendering any decision.

c. Reguest by Landowner - 2060 Felker Road -

The landowner has requested an escrow reduction for the property at 2060 Felker Road due to construction completed to date. HRG has conducted a site inspection and recommends the requested adjustment be approved.

Moved by Kopp, Seconded by Shellenhamer to approve the reduction of the escrow account for the 2060 Felker Road project.

MS-4 Environmental Department – Ms. Monique Dykman reported:

 Penn Vest meeting January 29th. CFA H20 Grant submitted for construction.
- Continued the Swatara Creek Road water line and will finalize townships portion to Iron Mine road.
- d. First phase of Sunset Park trail completed. Leveraged financing from DCNR grant.
- e. Lauffer Road bridge still in design and on schedule.

Mr. Letavic noted the H20 Grant (approximately \$ 959,000) should be announced in January and would be a combination of grant and loan.

Mr. Hershey discussed the first phase of the Sunset Park trail project and questioned the timeframe for bathroom projects. Mr. Letavic noted the bathroom project will be in the next phase.

Solicitor's Report - Mark Stewart - No report

EMA – Les Gilbert reported:

Mr. Gilbert requested grant money from Act 147. He was awarded about \$2,100 for equipment. Money will go back into the general fund once the money is attained. No emergencies have occurred. Mr. Gilbert mentioned they still need to stay up-to-date with training because TMI is still there. As far as he knows, there is one more drill and from there will need to see what happens. He mentioned something could happen up until the year 2075.
