CURRENT SITUATION

PADOH continues coordination efforts with FEMA, PEMA, and other state agencies through the Department Operations Center (DOC) to mitigate the impacts of COVID-19.

As of July 3, 2020, all Pennsylvania counties are in the green phase of the Governor’s re-opening plan.

Currently, there are 109,384 (+1,120) positive cases and 7,146 (+24) deaths in Pennsylvania. As of July 28, 2020, there have been positive cases at 835 (+4) LTC/PCH facilities, 41 jails/prisons, and 304 (+3) food industry facilities. 75% of all Pennsylvania positive cases are considered recovered. A recovered case is one that has not been reported as a death and is more than 30 days past the date of the positive test or onset of symptoms.

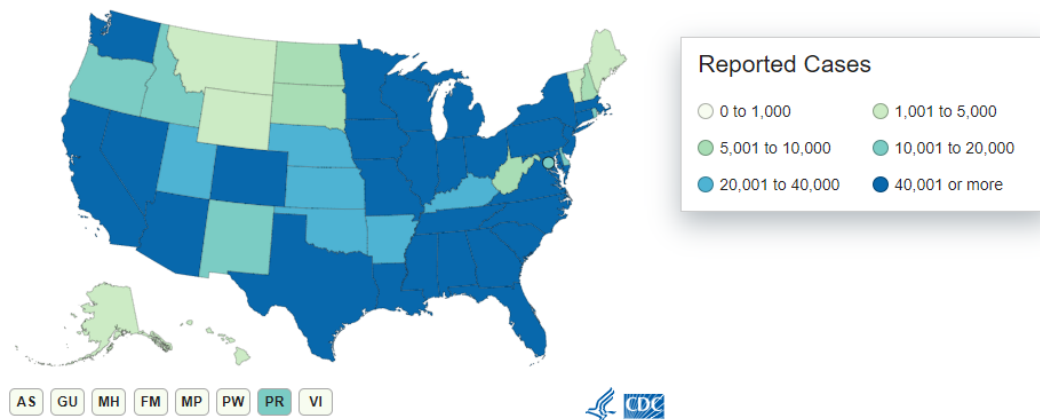
As of 1600 on July 28, 2020, there were 4,309,230 (+38,160) cases in the U.S, and 16,540,137 (+200,459) worldwide. There have been 148,298 (+1,045) deaths in the U.S. and 655,300 (+5,143) throughout the world.

Epidemiological investigations and contact tracing continue throughout the state to determine potential exposure of additional persons. The PA state lab has increased capacity to account for the testing surge. Commercial and medical system labs are on-line and testing for COVID-19.

Timeline:

- February 2, 2020 - PADOH Department Operations Center Activation
- March 4, 2020 - PEMA CRCC activation

March 6, 2020 - Governor’s Proclamation of Emergency
 March 11, 2020 - The World Health Organization declared COVID-19 a pandemic
 March 16, 2020 - Governor’s School Shutdown Order
 March 19, 2020 - Governor’s Order for all non-life sustaining business to close
 March 30, 2020 - FEMA Disaster Declaration (FEMA 4506-DRPA)

April 1, 2020 - Governor Wolf expanded the stay-at-home order to include the entire commonwealth
 April 3, 2020 - Citizens should wear a nonmedical or homemade mask when leaving their homes
 April 15, 2020 - Secretary Levine signed an order directing protections for critical workers who are employed at businesses that are authorized to maintain in-person operations during the COVID-19 disaster emergency.
 April 22, 2020 - Governor Wolf unveiled his detailed plan for opening the commonwealth with a start of May 8, 2020. Also, Secretary Levine outlined DOH’s plans for contact tracing, case investigation, and increased testing capacities.

May 7, 2020 - Governor Wolf extended the stay at home order for counties in the red phase until June 4, 2020
 May 8, 2020 - Phased reopening for Round 1 yellow counties
 May 15, 2020 - Phased reopening for Round 2 yellow counties
 May 22, 2020 - Phased reopening for Round 3 yellow counties and Round 1 of green counties
 May 29, 2020 – Phased reopening for Round 4 of yellow counties and Round 2 of green counties

June 3, 2020 – Secretary Levine announced that Walmart/Quest Diagnostics are opening drive-through testing locations throughout Pennsylvania in areas with few testing sites. The soft opening of five sites was on June 5, 2020.
 June 5, 2020 – Phased reopening for Round 3 of green counties
 June 8, 2020 – Secretary Levine issued an order requiring all nursing homes to complete initial baseline testing no later than July 24, 2020.
 June 12, 2020 – Phased reopening for Round 4 of green counties
 June 19, 2020 – Phased reopening for Round 5 of green counties
 June 26, 2020 – Phased reopening for Round 6 of green counties:

July 1, 2020 – Secretary Levine signed the Expanded Mask-Wearing Order, effective immediately
 July 3, 2020 – Phased Reopening for Round 7 of green counties. All PA counties operating within the green phase
 July 15, 2020 – Governor Wolf announced revised restrictions for Pennsylvania bars and restaurants
 July 16, 2020 – Secretary Levine announced updated guidance to safely reopen schools, and Governor Wolf announced the availability of \$50 million in grant funding for hazard pay to front-line employees in life-sustaining industries

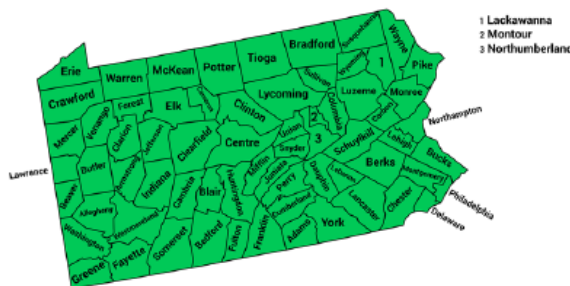
