

Late-Season Snowfall Expected

OVERVIEW:

- A slushy coating to several inches of wet snow is probable overnight Sunday into Monday.
- Snowfall amounts will be highly dependent on elevation.

TIMING & LOCATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Snow arrives 1-5AM; ends 11AM-5PM (southwest to northeast). ▪ Heaviest snow in higher elevations; lower amounts in the valleys. ▪ Snow will transition to rain mid-late morning Monday for all but the northern tier, where snow lingers through the afternoon.

HAZARDS & IMPACTS	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Slippery travel conditions are most likely during the predawn and early morning over the higher elevations.

FORECAST CHALLENGES	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ High confidence in timing; medium confidence in totals. Snowfall rates and timing will be a big factor for accumulation on roads especially at lower elevations/valleys.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The majority of the snow is forecast to fall on non-paved and elevated surfaces, which should limit travel impacts to some extent.

POST-EVENT OUTLOOK	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Temperatures remain above freezing in most areas Monday night ▪ Freeze-up risk is very low ▪ Dry weather Monday night-Tuesday
