PennDOT to Replace 12 Cross Pipes under Roundtop Road

Roundtop Road to be closed most weekdays in October, 6:00 AM – 6:00 PM

Harrisburg, PA – Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT) Dauphin County maintenance announced today that next week, weather permitting, a crew will begin a project to replace 12 metal drainage cross pipes under Roundtop Road in Londonderry Township. PennDOT advises motorists that Roundtop Road may be closed to through traffic most weekdays in October from 6:00 AM – 6:00 PM:

- October 3-5, between Schoolhouse Road and Route 341 (Colebrook Road) to replace three cross pipes,
- October 10-30, along State Game Lands No. 246 between Schoolhouse Road and Waltonville Road to replace nine cross pipes.

Highway maintenance workers will excavate the roadway and remove the existing corrugated metal pipes, replace them with plastic pipes, form inlet boxes, and reestablish the roadway. During the closure, detours using Schoolhouse Road and Colebrook Road will be available for motorists. PennDOT will return next summer to resurface the roadway between Colebrook Road and Waltonville Road with a Superpave asphalt leveling course.

Roundtop Road, officially designated as State Route 2005, averages more than 1,800 vehicles traveled each day between Schoolhouse Road and Waltonville Road.
